I am therefore looking for an upper Key Stage 2 teacher and a teacher who is familiar with the Year 7 expectations to join the Talent Pool and work together to support our schools in this important area. Sustainable Growth: Duncan Wright, CFO

We continue to be patient in relation to the transfer of Bridgnorth Endowed School to the Trust. We are still aiming for a 1st Sept transfer, however we remain at the mercy of the Department for Education (DfE) in relation to the unresolved land issues. Hodnet Primary School has submitted their academy application and we are confident that a decision will be reached before the end of term. Providing approval is given, we are looking at a conversion in late Autumn.



Building Projects Manager, Tim Dodington, is almost at the end of the Technology Barn project at St Martins 3-16 School. You'll recall that the project scope involved transforming the old construction centre into a state-of-the-art food technology room. I'm sure you can see from the photos that Tim and his team have done a fantastic job with the building unrecognisable from when Tim started there in late January. I know the school are excited to move in there during the summer ready for the new academic year.

This project has been funded via the School Condition Allocation (SCA) fund that the Trust receives each year. This grant (around £1m) is distributed on a needs basis, and with St Martins 3-16 school continuing to grow in numbers, a new technology space was needed. Tim's next project is at William Brookes School, where he will be working on creating a new SEN / Pastoral Hub on the ground floor as well as removing the balcony areas in the building. This work will take place over the 6 week summer holiday and be complete for the new academic year.

Every – our new HR Information System

In Autumn 2023 we will be launching Every; our new HR Information System.

This system will look to remove many paper-based processes, where staff will now be able to request special leave directly through the portal, notify of any changes to personal data, manage any return

to work following any sickness absence and request flexible working, amongst other things.

Our new recruitment process will also be embedded within this system, meaning all new applicants will apply directly through this Trust portal, ensuring a streamlined process from vacancy approval, shortlisting, through to starting in post, induction and probation.



In May, delegates welcomed further leadership facilitators to join them on Day 2 of the programme, hosted at Bridgnorth Endowed School. The morning of Day 2 focused on; understanding change management,

using best practice for developing initiatives and ideas and developing the

team to ensure a shared vision. The afternoon session saw our teaching delegates attend a session on leading curriculum change and our support staff delegates attend coaching essentials.

Feedback continues to be excellent and the collaboration amongst all delegates from across the Trust is inspiring!

My View Payslip System Upgrade

The Trust's payroll is provided through Shropshire Council. They will soon be launching a cloud-hosted upgrade of this system, which will provide increased functionality for staff in enabling them to change bank details directly on the portal, to see comparator pay over a period provided in a graphical format, view new style payslips and see clearly pension contributions made to you by the Trust.

There will be formal communications and a new URL shared with you soon and the good news is that your current usernames and passwords will remain the same!

With the end of the academic year in sight, preparations for the work in the holidays are gathering pace. The IT support team for the Trust are preparing to support or manage:

- The deployment of 100's of desktops and laptops across the schools
- The installation of **over 70**, 75" interactive panels across the schools
- The migration onto our central infrastructure and 365 tenant for Much Wenlock Primary School
- The commissioning of all IT services for Bowbrook Primary School
- The compete overhaul of the switch infrastructure at William Brookes School
- Connectivity in the new tech rooms at St Martins School
- Upgrade the WiFi network at Coleham Primary School


We have also recently outsourced our Data Protection Officer role to a company specialising in data protection and compliance in education. The service offers specialist data lawyers, available for unlimited support for all schools giving us the continued confidence that we can protect and manage all data to the highest of standards in our Trust.

Here are a few figures for you from the last month:

- The are now over 5.4 million OneDrive files stored in our 3-18Education.co.uk domain- up 12.5% in the last 90 days
- There are nearly 1.5 million files stored in your SharePoint sites- up 10% in the last 90 days
- There were over half a million emails sent or received in the last 30 days
- We have blocked 70 active intrusion attempts in the schools networks in the last 40 days and performed over 1.3 billion scans

BES Students Champion Mental Health Awareness

Bridgnorth Endowed School has gone the extra mile to boost mental health provision for its pupils through a brand-new peer-to-peer support initiative, which has just been launched.

Twenty one students received a full day of specialist training to become Mental Health Champions at a kickstarter course delivered by children's health and wellbeing crusaders, One Goal, last month.

The rigorous selection process saw students from across the school undertaking exercises and learning all about the role, before the final group began their training journey to prepare them for the challenge.

Year 10 student and Mental Health Champion, Amelie Maynard, said: "I learnt a lot from the course. It helped me understand what I need to do in order to help others and how to keep my own mental health on track."

The course covered key facts and looked at mental health on a personal level, it taught them how to use effective strategies to look after their own mental health as well as others, and showed them how to recognise warning signs and issues.

Teacher and project leader, Mr Chase, explained: "We were delighted by the response to this incredibly exciting and important programme."



"We hope that, by having the Mental Health Champions in place, students who are experiencing difficulties will feel more supported and be more likely to reach out to talk to their peers."

The new team of 'champions' are now ready to get to work and have been tasked with increasing awareness of the importance of mental health and promoting more open discussions.


Much Wenlock Primary: Carl Litchfield, Headteacher
