Student medical conditions and allergies are recorded on their medical records in Arbor.

Medicines

Students with serious medical conditions or asthma are known to the Student Support Assistant (Medical), who works proactively with parents to ensure that their children are as safe as possible here.

Students may carry their own inhaler with parental consent.

All medicines prescribed for a student's short-term use such as antibiotics and pain relief are stored in a locked medical cabinet in the medical room. A parental written agreement must be completed, and the Student Support Assistant (Medical) is responsible for administering medicines. An emergency inhaler is kept in the medical room.
